PETITION FOR BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN CONNECTION LODGED WITH COUNCIL

The Scotts Head Community Group has submitted a petition to Nambucca Valley Council calling for a feasibility study into options for a safe bicycle and pedestrian connection from Scotts Head to Macksville. The petition was supported by 978 signatures – a remarkable result given the total population of Scotts Head is less than 1,000!

The petition was accompanied by letters of support from key local organisations and businesses, including Reflections Holidays, Club Scotts, Macksville Country Club, Wheelsmith Bicycles and Mid Coast Travel.

Getting Council to undertake a feasibility study will be the first of many steps in a long process to create a safe and accessible connection for all. We will keep the community posted on our ongoing efforts to bring this idea into reality.



On these cold, blustery winter days, there can be nothing better than finding a cosy spot and reading a good 'whodunnit'. Fortunately, we have some great Australian writers of that genre. So let me fill you in on some of my favourites; Chris Hammer, Jane Harper, Emma Viskic, Candice Fox, Aoife Clifford, Dervla McTiernan, and Christian White.

My pick is Chris Hammer. He has written Scrublands, Silver, Trust, Treasure and Dirt, The Seven and The Tilt. My pick of Hammers' novels would have to be The Tilt. Tilt is a complex, multigenerational story set over 3-time periods; the 1940s, the 1970s and the present day. The storyline gradually unfolds when newly promoted Nell Buchanan and her boss Lucia are called in to investigate a skeleton when a water regulator is sabotaged. Then a



second more recent body is discovered close by. Set on the shore of the once great Murray River, this novel has it all, Twitchers, Crazy Right Wingers, and Neo Nazis. Hammer artfully connects the various threads of past historical periods so that you don't ever feel you've "lost the plot". Do go and check out his other novels. All are worthy reads!

Watch that weed!

You may have seen the ABC news article regarding the availability of gazania plants which are known to be invasive weeds & are being sold at Bunnings. Other weeds for sale include some of the succulent plants or plants such as aparagus fern and ivy. They are easy to grow so easily invade agriculture and natural environments and cost us \$4.3 billion dollars a year in damage.

What can you do? Research before you buy (just google the plant with the key word "weed"), ask your local supplier not to stock them and never dump your garden rubbish.

Plant these instead...

Choose endemic plants- these are plants that have naturally grown in our area for 1000s of years and are uniquely adapted to the climate and conditions.

If you are after something more exotic- make sure it is not a garden escapee. Consider it's seed heads; non native plants with red or black berries are often environmental weeds because they are so attractive to birds.

Better Bills Guidelines through our government energy regulator now requires energy retailers to tell their customers, just by a quick glance at their power bill, whether they could be on a better offer, and how to switch. Make sure you check a couple of bills. Energy made Easy is a government site to help you find a better deal

INSURANCE

moneysmart.gov.au is a useful site that explains terms used and how to choose car insurance.
You can compare greenslip insurers on https://www.greenslips.nsw.gov.au/
There are plenty of sponsored sites such as comparethemarket which will compare insurers .by just typing in your details. Remember that sponsored sites will offer you comparisons and you can certainly save money but the broker takes a %.

HEALTH INSURANCE

To allow for simpler comparison of health insurance products all Australian health insurers are required by law to provide details of each of their products to the Private Health Insurance Ombudsman.

PrivateHealth.gov.au contains details of every health insurance policy available in Australia, as well as its

Private Health Information Statement.



LAND CLEARING

Community members have recently expressed some concerns about land clearing activities happening in Scotts Head and surrounding areas. If you have concerns or questions about land clearing activities, your best option is to contact Nambucca Valley Council and relevant NSW agencies to raise issues, report what is happening and/or seek further information. You can do this in various ways:

- send a report to the NSW Environment Line at info@environment.nsw.gov.au or call them on 131 555.
