LOCAL WILDLIFE WARNINGS

STAY SAFE DURING SNAKE SEASON - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Snake season typically spans from late spring to early autumn when temperatures are warmer. During this time, snakes are more active, and they are most likely to be on the move in search of food and mates, which increases the chances of unexpected encounters. Whether you're hiking, gardening, or simply enjoying your backyard, here's a few quick tips for staying safe and coexisting peacefully with our slithering neighbours.

- Stay on Designated Trails avoid tall grass or dense brush where snakes may be hiding
- Be Mindful of Your Surroundings watch for movement or unusual patterns on the ground
- Wear Protective Clothing Thick materials are less likely to be penetrated by a snake bite
- Use Caution Around Water Many snake species are drawn to water sources

If you encounter a snake, stay calm and back away slowly. Do not try and handle the snake, if bites occur seek medical help immediately. Snake bites can be serious and prompt treatment is crucial.

IT'S MAGPIE SWOOPING SEASON - SO LET'S USE REASON DURING THE SEASON

Magpie breeding season is from August -November and is usually when swooping behaviour is observed. Our magpies are much loved and admired - except when we hear the clack of their beak millimetres above our head!

Magpies have excellent facial recall and very long memories. So, if you've been swooped before, or even if you just look like someone they swooped last year (e.g. a cyclist) you're likely to get the same treatment again.

What the science tells us, is that male magpies swoop to defend their chicks, not as an aggressive, unprovoked attack. As well as swooping, the male magpie also uses body language such as beak clapping to ward off potential threats. Some quick tips to avoid being swooped include:

- Walk a different route if you know there is a magpie defending its chicks
- Slow down when you see a magpie, so it recognises you as unthreatening
- Be alert not alarmed
- Wear a helmet when riding a bike it's a no brainer!



THIS MONTH'S BOOK REVIEW


I have not forgotten about all those non-fiction readers and arm-chair travellers out there. Two of my favourite travel writers are Bill Bryson and Paul Theroux. Bill Bryson's "A Walk in the Woods' is laugh out loud funny. It's about his hike along the Appalachian Trail with his friend Stephen Katz. Katz's profoundest wish was to go to a motel and watch X-Files. It was also made into an excellent movie starring Robert Redford & Nick Nolte.

Other Bryson book titles are "Notes from a Big Country," "Neither Here nor There," and "Down Under," in which Macksville gets a mention. Paul Theroux is a more serious travel writer. While Bryson's writing is witty and funny, Theroux's writing is more acerbic. Titles include "The Pillars of Hercules," a grand tour of the Mediterranean. "The Old Patagonian Express"; travelling by luxury express and squalid local trucks from Boston to the Great Plateau of Patagonia and my favourite "Riding the Iron Rooster", where Theroux travels by train through every province of PRC, from the searing hot Gobi Desert to the ice-bound cities of the Siberian border; along the South China Sea to the edge of Tibet.

Moving along to a more recent History/Travel writer, is Richard Fidler. His book "The Ghost Empire" is a brilliant reconstruction of the saga of power, glory, invasion, and decay that is the 1,000-year story of Constantinople. Other titles are "The Golden Maze," a biography of Prague. "The book of Roads & Kingdoms"; the story of the medieval wanderers who travelled out to the edges of the known world during Islam's fabled Golden Age, and finally "Saga Land: The Island stories at the edge of the world"; true stories of the first Viking families who settled on Iceland in the Middle Ages.

Well, that's your lot for the month. So, until next month, happy reading to you all.

Recipe of the Month

Pork And Cabbage Rolls

Ingredients

8 large cabbage leaves, trimmed

- 300 grams minced (ground) pork
- 2 cup (300g) cold cooked white rice
- 700-gram bottled tomato pasta sauce

Method

Boil, steam or microwave cabbage leaves briefly until pliable, drain. Rinse under cold water, drain. Pat dry with absorbent paper.

Heat oiled large frying pan, cook pork, stirring, until browned all over. Remove from heat, gently stir in rice, season to taste.

Divide rice mixture between cabbage leaves, roll firmly to enclose filling, folding in edges. Cook rolls, in single layer, in large baking paper-lined bamboo steamer over large saucepan of simmering water about 10 minutes or until heated through.

Meanwhile, bring sauce to the boil in medium saucepan, reduce heat, simmer, uncovered, about 10 minutes or until thickened slightly, season to taste. Serve cabbage rolls with sauce.
