
The book 'Surf Like a Woman', takes the reader through many fascinating stories in Menczer's life, and there's a lot of them. It also goes through her legendary World Title win, her struggles with illness and her identity as a gay woman during the 80s and 90s surf culture.

Menczer says that many of the younger female athletes and commentators out there don't have many ways to learn the history of women in surfing. And while there's still much work that still needs to be done to support female surfers, Menczer wants them to be able to hear the stories of the women before them, who fought for the opportunities available in sport today.

Pauline Menczer put in a lifetime of groundwork to pave opportunities for women in surfing, and now she's inspiring the next generation of woman surfers with the release of her memoir. This is a very inspirational read!

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

LEMON & POLENTA CAKE

Ingredients

For the Cake:

- 1 cup butter (softened)
- 1 cup superfine sugar
- 1 ¾ cups ground almonds
- ¾ cup fine cornmeal polenta
- 1 ½ teaspoons baking powder
- 3 eggs
- 1 ½ tablespoons lemon zest

For the Syrup:

- ½ cup lemon juice
- ¾ cup icing sugar

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180º c.
- 2. Line base of a 9-inch springform pan with baking paper and grease sides with butter.
- 3. Combine almonds, cornmeal and baking powder in a bowl and set aside.
- In another bowl beat butter and superfine sugar until pale (use a hand mixer).
- To the butter/sugar mixture add some of the almond/cornmeal mixture, followed by 1 egg, and continue to beat.
- 6. Alternately add the almond/cornmeal mixture followed by an egg until it is all incorporated, beating the whole time.
- 7. Beat in the lemon zest.
- 8. Scrape batter into prepared pan and bake for 40 minutes.
- 9. Test using a cake tester, the cake will be done, but might seem a bit "wobbly", the cake should be shrinking away from the side of the pan.
- 10. Remove and set on a wire rack (leave the cake in the pan).
- 11. Make your simple syrup by combining the lemon juice and icing sugar in a small saucepan.
- 12. Bring to a boil and cook until all the sugar is dissolved.
- 13. Prick the top of the cake all over with a cake tester.
- 14. Pour the warm syrup over the cake.
- 15. Let cool completely before removing from tin.
- 16. Slice, and if desired garnish with powdered icing sugar and berries.

RFS REPORT - OCTOBER 2024

The annual Get Ready Weekend activity held last month was a timely reminder that the Bush Fire Danger Period in the Nambucca Valley began at the start of September.

Scotts Head brigade volunteers were on hand to provide information about the seasonal outlook and specific risks in our area. We also had conversations about what every member of the community can do to prepare for the possibility of bush fires in the vicinity.

Some of the younger participants enjoyed trying their hand on the fire hose and all attendees were interested to view the fire trucks up close and find out about our new equipment and capability. The most popular part of the day was without doubt the demonstration involving Compressed Air Breathing Apparatus.

In the coming months, the Scotts Head brigade will be conducting local area familiarisation activities for our members. This includes identifying access points, suitable water sources, potential hazards, possible staging areas, etc. All local knowledge could come in handy one day.

LOCAL NEWS

CONVERSATION (YARNING) CIRCLE

Nambucca Valley Council recently advised that funding has been secured to construct a Conversation (Yarning) Circle on the village green in Adin Street opposite Scotts Head Central.

The proposal was put to council by the SHCG in early 2021 with the aim to create an area where people could gather casually on the village green opposite the shops and cafes. The design that accompanied the proposal included 6 x 2.4m hardwood benches arranged around a gravel circle featuring a masonry centre piece/pit.

Council has advised that the project is likely to be completed in early 2025. The SHCG would like to thank council for their support for this initiative and their ongoing support of our community. We look forward to the project's completion and the additional amenity it will provide residents and visitors when using this area.
