It's a family drama, coming of age, literary fiction novel that begins beneath a wild fig tree on the Mid North Coast.



#### **RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

#### THECHINE TOMATO AND SPINACH MUSEINS

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 cup (150g) self-raising flour
- 60g butter, chopped
- 1 zucchini, coarsely grated
- 60g baby spinach, shredded
- 100g fetta, crumbled
- 1 Egg, lightly whisked
- 1/2 cup (125ml) milk
- · 4 cherry tomatoes, thinly sliced

#### Method

#### 1. Step 1

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line six ¾-cup (80ml) muffin pans with paper cases. Place flour and butter in a bowl. Use your fingertips to rub the butter into the flour until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add zucchini, spinach and fetta. Stir to combine.

#### 2. Step 2

Whisk the egg and milk in a small jug. Add to the flour mixture and stir until just combined (don't overmix). Spoon evenly among the prepared muffin pans. Top with tomato slices. Bake for 20-25 mins or until a skewer inserted in the centres comes out clean. Turn onto a wire rack to cool completely.

#### INQUIRY INTO COMMUNITY SAFETY IN REGIONAL AND RURAL COMMUNITIES

At the invitation of the Member for Oxley, Mr Michael Kemp, SHCG Chairperson Tony Crimmins recently attended and addressed the NSW Parliamentary Committee on Law and Safety, who convened in Kempsey as part of an inquiry into community safety in regional and rural communities.

Mr Kemp was desirous for all areas of the electorate of Oxley, including small and isolated communities such as Scotts Head, to be represented at the inquiry and to have the opportunity to tell their story to the Committee.

The Committee were grateful to hear that the Scotts Head community enjoys a positive relationship with the local Police Command and community members know that Police will always respond to calls for assistance. Tony emphasised that whilst this brought some comfort to the community, this reactionary style of policing had not proved effective to counter the anti-social behaviour typically experienced in the village (and other small, isolated villages) during peak holiday periods.

Unfortunately, very low Police staffing numbers in the Nambucca Valley mean that there are insufficient officers available to conduct proactive and community policing activities during peak periods, when such activities could provide a deterrent to the anti-social behaviour experienced by communities such as Scotts Head during these times of high visitor numbers.

Tony further emphasised that high levels of anger, frustration and disappointment were felt and expressed by community members both during and after these incidents.

In addition to convening in Kempsey the Committee also conducted hearings in Bourke and Broken Hill and will be visiting Coffs Harbour. Due to the number of submissions received the Committee has extended its community consultation into 2025.

There is no advice at this time as to when the results of the Committee's findings will be presented to the public.

#### MASTER PLAN FOR SCOTTS HEAD VILLAGE

In July 2024 Nambucca Valley Council endorsed a submission (supported by SHCG) for the preparation of a master plan for the core visitor precinct at Scotts Head and surrounding community lands.

On Tuesday 22 October representatives of the SHCG met with senior members of the Nambucca Valley Council (General Manager, Director Engineering, Manager Property) for an initial discussion on how the master plan would be progressed.

Council confirmed their support for the preparation of the master plan, in consultation with key partners (Crown Lands, Reflections Holidays, National Parks and Wildlife Service and the community) and indicated they are working to integrate this project into the next council budget cycle. Once that is confirmed, it should result in resources being allocated to get the master plan underway.

This is great news for the Scotts Head community as it has been well over a decade since any detailed planning was undertaken for the core visitor precinct and a lot has changed in that time. The master plan process will be a terrific opportunity for the community to contribute to the discussion and put forward their ideas for our village both now and into the future.

SHCG is grateful for the continued support of the Nambucca Valley Council, without whose support this very important piece of planning for the future of our village would not be possible.

As more information becomes available, community updates will be provided on this website and in the Scotts Head Wave monthly newsletter.
